# The Following Is From Our Rules & Regulations (page 12)

# COMPLIANCE WITH RULES AND REGULATIONS

All owners, lessees and their guests shall fully comply with these rules and regulations. All residents must keep themselves continuously informed as to the content of these rules in their present form or as they may be amended from time to time, and will have the responsibility to keep their guests informed as may be appropriate on any occasion. If the Board believes any resident is in default with these rules, such resident will receive at least one (1) written notice of an alleged violation thereof, giving the resident at least seven (7) days to adhere to the rule before a fine is imposed. Fines may thereafter be imposed at the discretion of the Board.

- Conflict resolution. HOAs have best practices in place to mediate and resolve disputes that may arise between homeowners. This helps morale stay high and prevents issues from escalating.
- Enforced community standards. While some neighborhoods may have unofficial guidelines or suggestions for residents, HOAs can enforce the rules of their communities. If homeowners don't adhere to the standards of compliance, they typically receive a notice or may pay a fine.



Rules and regulations won't accomplish a thing without the voluntary cooperation of our residents. For without the voluntary cooperation of a majority of the members of a society, only chaos will result. In fact, voluntary cooperation is at the very heart of what it means to be a civilization. Let's all do our part to keep QMW a most desired place to call home!

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
