Greetings Fellow Quail Meadows West Residents

Over this last year, some laws have been enacted specifically for HOAs in California, resulting in changes to our governing documents. As with most things in life, change is inevitable.

- > Guest Parking Towing Requirements: On private property within Santa Maria, the tow requirement is 72 hours (Davis Stirling Civil Code states 96 hours). With our signage and after Santa Maria police review, we can now tow without notice after the 72-hour timeframe has elapsed. Guest parking is for guests only. Street parking is for loading and unloading only and no overnight/day parking is permitted and is subject to tow via SM Fire Marshall.
- > Statutory Default for Non-Responsive Owners: Notice by mail is now the statutory default for non-responsive owners. No other notice is required, and claiming non-receipt is no longer accepted by the courts.
- > Communication Preferences: Owners are solicited every year for their communication preferences, such as email, mail or both. This is done in our Annual Disclosure Statements.
- Messenger: Most homeowners are receiving the monthly "Messenger Newsletter" electronically (email) and not home delivered. This saves the HOA in time and money. Under consideration is for any homeowner wishing a printed copy, they will be able to pick it up at the clubhouse vs. being hand carried to your home by volunteers.
- > Rental Policies: Rentals are allowed in "owner-occupied" homes when renting a room.
- Non-Functional Turf: Beginning in 2029, Water Code Section 10608.14 (AB 1572) will require all HOAs with non-functional turf to remove it or use non-potable water for irrigation. As discussed in our meetings, we will save our walking trail park by designating it a "park" which falls under AB 1572 guidelines.
- Reminder: HOA Board, Committees and our website administrator are unpaid volunteers and deserve your respect and compliance.

- > Annual Disclosures: Annual disclosures are coming soon, so be on the lookout for this very important notice. It will be mailed to all owners. There are forms to fill out and return if there are any changes to household.
- > Community Directory: If there are any changes to your "community directory listing" please let us know as soon as possible. As a reminder, please support our advertisers who help pay for our Messenger and Directory.

CC&R's and Rules and Regulations

In the coming editions of the Messenger, we will be reviewing sections of our "Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions" (CC&R) and our "Rules and Regulations" to assist owners and residents in our understanding of the our shared responsibilities in keeping QMW the best private gated community on the Central Coast.



The Following Is From Our Rules & Regulations (pages 7-8)

ANIMALS AND/OR PETS

Upon the written request of any resident, the Board shall, in sole and absolute discretion, determine whether, for the purpose of this rule and regulation, a particular animal, bird or fish is or is not a domestic pet and/or whether the number thereof kept or maintained, or proposed to be kept or maintained, is reasonable.

The Board may, from time to time and in its sole and absolute discretion, determine if any such pet is or has become a nuisance and prohibit such pet as provided for by the Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions.

Animals, birds or fish may be kept or maintained in the Park as domestic pets. Each home may contain no more than two (2) dogs or two (2) cats or a combination of each species and no more than a reasonable number of small pets capable of being confined in cages.

Pets must be confined within the enclosed area of a unit and shall not at any time be loose in the Park or on other units. When notified, the Board may arrange to have loose animals impounded at the resident's expense. Each pet must be licensed and inoculated in accordance with local laws.

A resident or guest of a resident will be allowed to walk or exercise pets on any street within the park. THEY MUST BE ON A LEASH AT All TIMES. Pets will not be allowed in front yards of other residences. Under no circumstances will animals be allowed in the clubhouse, swimming pool area, picnic area or any other recreational area. Any time a pet is not in their own back yard, the owner must have them on a leash.

Each resident must carry the supplies with them and clean up any excrement from their pet. Residents are solely responsible to clean up the unit or lot site where an animal or other pet is kept or maintained. Disposal of pet waste or excrement is the resident's responsibility and under no circumstances is any project facility to be used for this purpose.

Pets will not be allowed to cause any disturbance which might annoy neighbors. Disturbances may be described as, but not limited to, barking, growling, caterwauling, or any unusual noises, biting, or causing damage, or offensive odors which will annoy or cause harm to a resident. If a pet causes a disturbance, a first notice will be sent. If a second violation is noted or a second valid complaint is received by the Board, the pet owner will receive a notice to dispose of the pet.



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
